Behavior Policy

Unity Skating Club has a mission of providing a welcoming, safe place for all children to attend. The success of this program is dependent on the Coaches and Program Assistants being treated respectfully and having parent support. Our coaches will endeavour to use positive reinforcement and redirection before disciplinary steps are taken.

For minor occurrences (examples: disrupting activities, not listening to coaches, and/or being disrespectful to other children or coaches), the child will be warned and told of the consequences of their actions. If warnings persist numerous times or during multiple CanSkate sessions, the parents will be notified.

For major occurrences (examples: repetitive bullying behavior, any form of violence (ie. fighting, threats), extreme disrespect of others (including coaches), destroying the programs property, outright refusal to work with coaches), parents will be notified and asked to take their child off the ice immediately and suspended for one additional skating session.

The parent/ guardian will be notified by a coach or executive member on the first and second instance and on the third


EQUIPMENT

- Must wear CSA Approved helmet
- Bicycle, ski, snowboard and other types of helmets are not permitted >
- Leather skates with laces are preferred for their ankle support & flexibility
- Molded skates are not reccommended. They do not provide ankle flexibility
- Thin socks/tights should be worn in skates for warmth & better skate fit
- Dress in layers, avoid bulky jackets as they do not allow for flexability
- Gloves or mittens

QUALITY/PROPER FITTING SKATES IS KEY

A good pair of skates will provide firm support around the ankle, preventing your skater's ankle from turning inwards or outwards as they stand on the blades. When skates are laced up snugly, the ankles should be straight in the boot.







Plastic molded skates prevent the boot from flexing properly to allow the skater the required range of motion. While they are convenient, they often come loose leaving the skater with no support whatsoever.

Shoe size does not necesarily cross over to skate size. When in doubt remove the skate liner and have your child step on it. There should be no more than half an inch of space at the toe. Skater should be able to wiggle their toes inside the boot but their heel should not move at all in the skate. Take the skaters foot width into consideration as well, skates do come in different widths.
